

Dear Pastor,

My name is Andrew Day. I am writing this letter to introduce myself and my burden for the nation of Ireland. My wife and I have surrendered our lives to reach the Irish people with the Gospel of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Our desire is to get to the mission field, to start Independent Fundamental Baptist churches, and to see the Irish nation once more turned to Christ.

I was saved as a seventeen year old teenager on November 14, 1999, at Grace Baptist Church in Gaylord, Michigan, under the leadership of Dr. Jon M. Jenkins. In 2001, I began attending the Grace Baptist Bible Institute that later became Grace Baptist College.

During my senior year of Bible College, the Lord began dealing with my heart one night at work about the country of Ireland. I surrendered my heart to go and asked Him to provide a way for me to go on a two week trip to visit Ireland that summer.
